










Paper towel holder with leather strap



The products you need:

- Leather strap, 30 mm wide
- Wooden plate, 150 mm
- Sam Browne Button
- Nail
- Glue
- Punch tong
- Hammer
- Ruler
- Drilling machine
- Round stick
- Drill
- Saw
- Sandpaper

<p>Step 1</p> <p>Drill a hole in the wooden plate.</p>	
<p>Step 2</p> <p>Use a saw to cut the round stick into the desired length. Cut off the end at an angle.</p>	
<p>Step 3</p> <p>Hammer two nails into the leather piece and the wooden plate.</p>	
<p>Step 4</p> <p>Apply glue to the hole and the stick and leave it to get slightly tacky.</p>	

<p>Step 5</p> <p>Hammer the round stick into the wooden plate.</p>	
<p>Step 6</p> <p>Use the sandpaper to smooth out the edges.</p>	
<p>Step 7</p> <p>Attach a fresh roll of paper towel and measure out, where the leather strap will be cut.</p>	
<p>Step 8</p> <p>Cut the leather into size and cut off its corners.</p>	
<p>Step 9</p> <p>Glue on the Sam Browne button.</p>	

Step 10

Punch two holes with your rotary leather punch, so that it gets possible to tighten in the leather strap, once the paper towel gets smaller.
